Trends

Growing up my sisters had the running joke that Lewis County always caught the back end of current fashion "trends". They would say that when flannel shirts were "in", we were still on the Hawaiian shorts trend, but we'd catch up soon. Since I became an administrator it's interesting to see that our pattern of trends not only is behind in fashion but in other areas as well. Some of these trends have affected schools.

Attendance

There is a national trend after the pandemic for students to be absent more often. This has resulted in an increase in chronic absenteeism. Nationwide there has been an increase of 8 million absences for the 22-23 school year over the 18-19 school year. * (Research is still out on the specific reasons, but there are theories. One of the theories relates to the thought that parents' perspectives of attendance have changed since the pandemic and that the benefits of absence are beginning to outweigh the benefits of attendance. Whenever there is a nationwide trend it is important for us to see what has happened locally.

At Beaver River comparatively in 2018-2019 we had a 95% attendance rate whereas in 2022-2023 we had a 93% attendance rate. While that may not sound like a significant amount, when you break down the absences, it's a difference of 2689 daily absences. With an average instructional time of 5 hours per day that is total of 13,445 hours of missed instructional time. This data only includes a full daily absence. We have also noticed a rise in late arrivals and early dismissals. For instance in the 2018-2019 School year there were 2,261 late arrivals and 4793 early dismissals, and in 2022-2023 there were 2481 late arrivals and 6,688 early dismissals. There wasn't a significant change in late arrivals, however, there was 40% increase for early dismissals.

While we do have attendance policies that have consequences for excessive absences, that is not the reason for concern. According to the National Center of Education Statistics (NCES) "Students who attend school regularly have been shown to achieve at higher levels than students who do not have regular attendance. This relationship between attendance and achievement may appear early in a child's school career."

From my own experience, students who regularly attend school are more engaged in the school community, have a higher level of self-confidence, and perform better than those students that miss significant amounts of school. There is value to students becoming part of a larger community and finding their role in that community. I would encourage parents to reassure their students that they are a valuable part of the school and being present is the only way to bring that value to. Even if they have a free period/study hall at the end of the day they could use that time to support other students if they are done with all of their schoolwork.

We were fortunate to have a local beekeeper, Dr. Elwin Stillman visit the second grade classes to teach them about bee keeping and the importance of bees! Thank you to Dr. Stillman for sharing your knowledge and honey! The second graders also learned about fire safety this month with a visit from Mr. Collin Edick, a local volunteer firefighter. Students were able to see the equipment and truck used by firefighters while learning about fire safety.

Throughout the first quarter of school, second graders have been learning new phonics skills, reading, writing, adding, and subtracting. We look forward to meeting with families at parent teacher conferences in November!



BIG BROTHER/BIG SISTER PROGRAM

At the end of last school year along with the retirement of Wanda Joslin, I was asked to become the new advisor for the Big Brother/Big Sister program. Over the past month, I have spent many hours dedicated to matching high school students grades 9-12 (aka “bigs”) to students in grades PreK- 8 (aka “littles”). Once in a 6-day cycle bigs choose to forgo one period of a study hall to connect, bond and spend time with their “little”. Bigs and littles can do things such as arts/crafts, play games, do puzzles, help with homework, go for a walk if the weather permits or use the gymnasium if available. Currently, there have been approximately 40 high school students that have signed up to be a Big Brother/Big Sister, with more students signing up daily. I have made 34 matches at this time. We consider Bigs to be good role models and give our younger students someone to look up to.

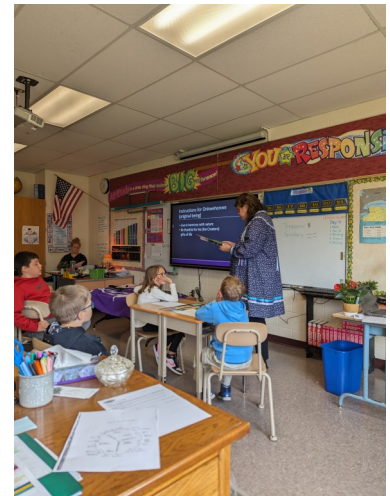

FORTH GRADE NEWS

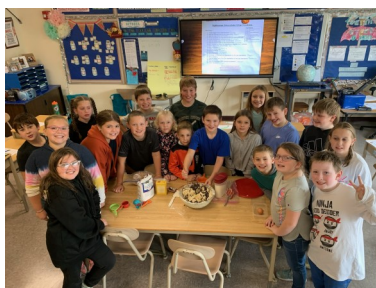

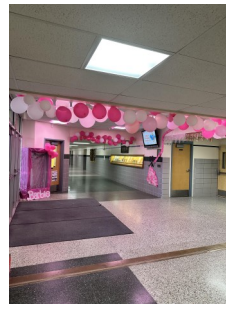
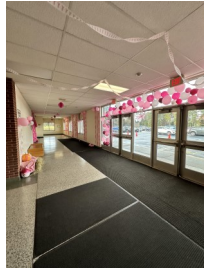
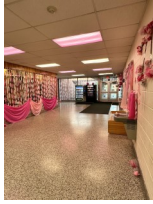
The fall athletics regular season has come to a close for the 2023 school year. As athletes arrived back in late August, it was a joy to see the school grounds filled for another season.

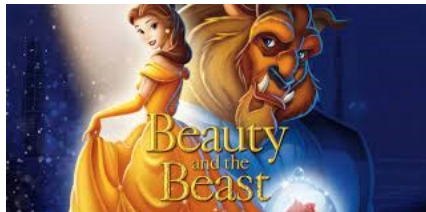
